

Some items to consider in selecting a new president: We have been a low-key conservative group of friends, deliberately with few rules. Arizona is a casual, conservative, and laid back state. Radical changes to the club can hurt the membership and create conflicts.

We have deliberately not created a set of bylaws or rules to govern ourselves. As an adult organization we have solved any problems without difficulty, as friends do. I do not believe a set of bylaws is needed, or even wanted. Insurance for the club is becoming a necessity due to the problems with rampant lawsuits being filed today. This is being looked into by Ron Gurnee and will be presented for consideration at the next meeting. I recommend passage.

We have been incorporated in the past. This proved to be much paperwork and created a tax problem, so as a non-profit organization with limited funds, the club wisely decided to drop this burden. We were open to government probing and auditing at any time.

Triumphest has been our moneymaker to keep the club operating in the interim. Regarding the funds needed to start the next Triumphest, I believe we should protect adequate funds for our next Triumphest in 2007 by putting an amount in a trust or certificate of deposit until we need them. That way funds will be assured to be available.

We were a member of the VTR in the past. This has lapsed and should be reinstated. The Triumph logo has been with us since inception. The color scheme has also existed and can be reviewed, upgraded, or changed if needed. Club jackets and hats in blue have always been available from Stitches Unlimited, although with our weather use has been limited. A polo or tee shirt is also available. We can certainly review these items and make changes if desired.

The club is meeting at Manuels by common consent. This may not be the best place to meet. The room is cramped and too noisy. However after being put out of the El Zaribah Shrine temple on very short notice, we looked at many possible meeting places. Most either were not applicable or were not affordable for everyone. If were are not happy at Manuel's, we need suggestions for a new place to meet. I suggest recommendations be made at the next meeting.

We are always open to changes to the club to keep current. I firmly believe we have continued as a club and have survived by not making radical changes. The needs of our members new and old can and should be addressed. Your input is the fodder that makes us what we are.

As president I would value and implement the input of members and attempt to guide the club through 2003.


