
Come and enjoy road racing at its best! Return to a quieter time when SCCA and Road Racing were common events and less hectic.

In 1984 Arizona passed a law stating that whenever there was a sale "...on certain vehicles, ... valued over \$750, ...by private parties, the BUYER MUST PAY A 4% SALES TAX at the time of title transfer. A Committee to Repeal Casual Auto Sales Tax (CAST)has been formed. This committee is the

spearhead of action to repeal this tax and petitions are being circulated for registered voters to sign. Approximately 100,000 signatures are needed to get this impopular issue on the November 1986 General Election Ballot. Then the people can decide whether or not to repeal this law.

c. build two more testing stations,


d. raise fee from \$.75 to \$1.25, and

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
