


In Sedona early, some slept, some went shopping, and some found the closest bar; everybody scattered later to their own style of restaurant.

- WHAT TO BRING -


Steaks, Hamburgers, Hot Dogs to grill

Guitars, harmonicas, etc.


- WHAT NOT TO BRING Ghetto Blasters (they didn't exist back then)


