LUCAS BATTERIES

(Thefollowing article is reprinted "en toto" from the Blue Bonnet, newsletter of the Texas Triumph Register.)

While Gary and I were at the Vintage Triumph Register meet in Fort Mitchell, KY, we saw a really exquisite TR3A with what appeared to be a brand new Lucas battery. The battery was correct in every way, big red "LUCAS" letters, screw on terminals, and of the correct size. We were suitably impressed, and we asked how the owner had found such a treasure. Much to our surprise, he told us that he had bought the battery right here in the United States and when he got back home he would send us the address of the manufacturer.....Weil, he was as good as his word and we have since contacted the company and would like to share the information with the club.

The company is the Dave Lane Battery Co. located in Hudson, Ohio. Dave can provide batteries for 1950 to 1968 TR2, TR3, TR4, Renown, and 2000 which take group 27C (12 1/2"x 7"x 9" high to top of post) and for 1950 to 1966 TR4A, TR250, TR6, 1200, Mayflower, Sports 6, Herald and Spitfire which take group 24C which are (10 3/4"x 7"x 9" high to top of post). The batteries have a three year warranty (pro-rated). They are of the tar top design and use a hard rubber case with "LUCAS" embossed on the side. It is a dry charged battery which means you don't have to fill it with acid and charge it until you are ready to use the battery. The batteries cost \$125.00 each plus UPS charges. Club members can get a \$5.00 discount if they mention that they belong to the Texas Triumph Register with their order. Dave tells me he can rebuild any (for the most part) hard rubber case batteries up to 1968-69. In fact. Ron Stein, was going to contact Dave to see if his original Standard battery could be rebuilt. It will be interesting to see how that works out.....Those of you that received the Christmas Wish Catalog from the Roadster Factory may have seen Charles Runyan's advertisement for Lucas batteries. They are, in fact, Dave's batteries, and since Charles charges only \$137.50 for them, his profit may be "minimal" as he states.

WHAT HAPPENED MONTH BEFORE LAST


Every once in a blue moon I make a a mistake. And most of the times I get away with it. BUT NOT THIS TIME!

ALL BRITISH CAR SHOW, 8 March 1992

I know it is two months away, but we only have the February meeting to fine tune the details for our participation in this annual event put on by the AZ MG Club. In the past it has been held in the Town & Country Shopping Center. However the meet has grown bigger than the space available and has been moved to the Metrocenter Shopping Center. Enclosed with the newsletter, is the flyer and the registration form for entry into the show. Note that registration is \$10. until 22 February when it jumps to \$20. Only pre-registered cars are guaranteed dash plaques.

BUILD RECORD GOODIES

All of us have talked about colors we have seen on TRs, some of them are pretty unusual - to say the least! So, for this article I think I will pass along some different color combinations used on early TRs.

Here are some examples of colors that have adorned the TR exterior: Ice Blue, Geranium, Olive Yellow, Apple Green, Pearly Grey, Phantom Blue, Primose Yellow, Sunset Red, Beige, and Wedgewood Blue. The is does not include the usual Pearl White, Black, British Racing Green, Signal Red, and Powder Blue.

Interior colors vary somewhat less widely that the exterior, but were extreme in their own right, here are some examples: Blackberry, Geranium, Grey, Blue, and Targo Purple. As with the exterior, there were the usual colors of Black and Red.

The combinations of these two groups are what makes for an unusual car! Apple Green with a Brown Leather interior; Primose Yellow with a Blue Leather interior; Geranium with a Blackberry Leather interior; Olive Yellow with a Geranium Leather interior; or Ice Blue with a Blackberry Leather interior. There were, of course, the usual color combinations of Red cars with Black interiors or White cars with Black interiors, and in a greater number than the odd ones - but isn't that always the case?

To continue this train of thought, most cars seem to have been fitted with soft tops, and here the color is not as varied as either the interior or the exterior colors, but there are some I had never heard of before - Ice Blue, Blackberry, Geranium, Beige, Fawn, as well as the more usual Black and White.

Some of the color combinations seem unusual, but there are others that would seem to be very striking, for example: Pearl White exterior, Grey Leather interior and an Ice Blue soft top; Ice Blue exterior, Blackberry interior and a Blackberry soft top; Geranium exterior, Grey interior, and an Ice Blue soft top.

I have heard a story that I'm not sure is true, but I like it and it explains some of the color combinations I have included above: Sir John Black's wife is said to have made the color choices for the early TR-2s - it is rumored that she was color blind! And that is why the strange color combinations stopped with the TR-2!
