NIGHT DESERT BARBEQUE

As threatened last month, we are going to invade the County-owned gravel pit again on Saturday night, August 19. I drove up there on Monday the 31st and found it to be even better than it used to be. There is plenty of room to park and all of the equipment is gone. Bring a cooler full of stuff to eat and drink, lawn chairs or blankets to sit on, but please leave your boom boxes at home. Try to show up around sunset. (The sun set at 7:30 last week). With luck, we will have a barbeque grill to roast your weenies, Bratwursts or steaks. This spot is at about 3500 feet, so it's a little cooler than the valley. You might want to bring a jacket or sweater (no kidding). Follow the simple directions below to get there:

- 1. Take PIMA ROAD North. You will encounter several traffic lights, but the only STOP sign is the one at Cave Creek Road, 13.3 miles North of Frank Lloyd Wright Boulevard.
- 2. Turn RIGHT at the STOP onto CAVE CREEK ROAD.
- 3. A little less than 5 miles up Cave Creek Road is the turnoff to the right for Bartlett Lake. GO STRAIGHT at this intersection toward Seven Springs.
- 4. About 2.5 miles after the Bartlett turnoff, the pavement ends just after a sharp left.
- 5. Take the first RIGHT turn, climbing the little hill. The gravel pit is on your left immediately after the hill crest.
- 6. Circle the wagons, uncork a cold one and ENJOY!

A first for Triumph, the Stag was first launched in the late spring of 1970 in Northern Belgium with the first customer deliveries in September 1970. 25 YEARS AGO.

The Stag is powered by a 2997cc or 3.0 liter V8, twin overhead cam, dual carbureted engine which propels the unibody, independent rear suspension platform to respectably quick times thru an automatic or 4-speed manual gearbox available with overdrive. A unique removable hardtop all the Michelotti-penned Spitfire...you'll note a strong family resemblance...and a leather padded 'tri-bar' roll bar gives the Stag a truly distinctive profile top up or down. Stags saw some limited racing in Europe and some engine refinement was carried into the late Stag line as a result.

Of the 25,877 Stags produced only 6,780 were exported and the bulk of these to Australia where the unique Triumph GT road car gain wide popularity of the less than 3000 Stags Imported to the US, we hope you'll find those presented at TRIUMPHES ARE A CREDIT TO THE MARQUE and give Credit to their Devoutly loyal owners for the hard work it takes to maintain what ARGUABLY THE RAREST AND POSSIBLY THE FINEST PRODUCTION ROADCAR TRIUMPH EVER PRODUCED.
