

MINUTES OF THE FEBRUARY MEETING

MAKING BRACKETS

Over the years I have made many brackets. Most have required bending in some for or another. My metal bending techniques have been somewhat less than perfect. Normally I would heat up the area that was to be bent, beat the hell out of it with a large hammer and hope that I had guessed the point of the bend correctly.

When bending a bar of steel, I had been using a narrow flame to heat a line on the piece and restrict the bend to a small radius. I had a large plate (4.5") wide to bend at an exact point, but I was not happy with guessing the point where the bend would occur.

The only way was to restrict the radius to a particular line. The answer seems to be in backing the piece being bent with another piece the same width or larger, clamping both in a heavy vise and heating both then hammer bending to the angle needed. Hot or cold, rolled steel requires heating to at least cherry red to light orange. Then slowly bending while keeping heat applied. This worked well and gave me the radius and angle needed. Be careful not to rush the bend as cracks will appear like magic.

You might try this technique next time your need a non-standard part.


