

As no other events were scheduled this month, we decided to count the All British Breakfast Run to the Wigwam as our August event.



ON PHOTO ENFORCEMENT

Photo Radar (PRD) was invented in Germany, where the law states that when a vehicle is observed in violation of a law, the OWNER is responsible regardless of who was driving. Therefore, a picture of the speeding car can legally be enough evidence to support a traffic violation. Somebody (Paradise Valley) decided that PRD could be a lucrative cash cow and pressed several units into immediate service without checking our traffic laws. In this country, it's the OPERATOR's responsibility, not the owner's, to belly up to the fine or school or whatever. PV proceeded to set up these diabolical machines right where everybody goes fast and began to mail out tickets. Surprise! A large number of these tickets were PAID by mail, the victims being hoodwinked into believing they had no choice. The original photos were of the front of the car only and didn't have sufficient resolution to identify the driver. Some folks read the Arizona law carefully and discovered that it is NOT required to mount a front license plate, so they removed them. This forced PV into modifying the system to take TWO pictures (front AND rear). They are still mailing tickets (illegally) and collecting fines. It's nothing more than a scam.

Lately, PV and Scottsdale have installed "Photo Red Light" (PRL) devices in several locations. These boxes will take your picture if your car is beyond the painted (red) line when the light turns red. Even if the timer says the "violation" occurred .008 seconds after the red signal, they will say "You did it" and slap you with fines of up to \$150. Once again, they are ignoring the law and sending the "evidence" to the car's owner.

Hayden & Indian Bend


It would seem that Scottsdale has expended quite a bundle to install these traps and expects to recover their costs and then some. PV has set the benchmark for "easy money" through the PRD's and the PRL's. Scottsdale has once again followed suit by setting up its own PRL's (list above) and PRD's. The PRD's are mobile units and are regularly moved around. I saw one of Scottsdale's PRD's clocking traffic on northbound Hayden Road during the 5-6PM rush hour. Nobody could even reach the 45MPH speed limit, let alone go "Too Fast". A ridiculous waste of money and manpower. Most of the time these things run unattended, but it still takes time to set them up.

My opinion? These gadgets are illegal and you can tear up any ticket you get in the mail. The burden is on the accuser to POSITIVELY identify the person driving the car in the photo. Difficult to do. Obey the traffic laws, don't run red lights (even by milliseconds) and carry a rubber Nixon mask with you at all times. Good hunting!


