



It seems like everyone has their own special brand of penetrating solution. I have been using Kroil to break into rusted nuts & bolts. Kroil has worked well and broken loose any number of stuck nuts. However, with the changing technology, trying new and different things is in order.

We had a new heat pump installed last fall and I helped the installer, who used a different penetrating oil. He showed me a bottle of RUST BUSTER that he gets at the local sheet metal & furnace supplier on Hatcher Rd. I stopped by and bought a bottle and put it away. Last week the starter motor on the TR/8 went futz and I had to remove the down pipe and catalytic converter to get at it. I could not find the Kroil, but found the Rust Buster. I soaked the three nuts on the exhaust manifold all night and hoped for the best.

The next day I attacked the nuts with a wrench and, to my surprise, they came loose with very little effort! I took a good look at the nuts and the rust was indeed cleaned away from the threads. Chemical compounds are becoming very specific and this is a fine example of one that is use specific.
