

Saturday, July 17 at 4-5-6:00 PM



HAND CLEANER

Over the years I have tried many brands and types of hand cleaners. When you do your own automotive work, you really can get dirty. Fast Orange, Goop and Sta-Lube come to mind when thinking about cream-style cleaners, and of course there is always good old Lava soap.

Back in Ohio, I used a product called "DL Blue Label" hand cleaner. I was available in most parts stores and it really works. My wife discovered that it would remove chewing gum from the kids' hair and that you could rub it into an oil stain on clothing just before throwing it in the washer. Sort of a predecessor to "Spray 'n' Wash".

When we first moved to Arizona, I made an effort to locate the DL people, without much success. An auto parts store back in Ohio offered to ship me a case, but I thought that was overkill.

Now, along comes the Internet! I spent a few minutes searching the 'net for DL and came up with the following:

DL Blue label is still available, but is now a Loctite product. Looking at Loctite's home page, I found the part numbers for the wall dispenser and the 4.5 lb can of DL, and a list of distributors right here in Phoenix.

Here is the list:

I called both companies and found that Motion Industries had a little better pricing. I ordered a 4.5 lb can and a dispenser using my credit card and it was on my doorstep in two days for a little over 20 bucks.

I happened to be in an Auto Zone store last week, and they had the 14 oz cans of DL on the counter. I didn't check their price.

Although I don't need to remove any chewing gum, I still get my hands plenty dirty and I do occasionally get some stains on my clothes. Now I can deal with it.

Get yourself some of this stuff - it really works!




