

DIANE'S TIDBITS







CLEANING PARTS DURING RESTORATION

If you are going to restore a car, most often you will decide to replace all of the suspension bushings, oil seals and such. In the process of removing some components, you have a choice as to whether to thoroughly clean the "hard parts" or just wash them off. (You certainly wouldn't put them back on dirty). Here's a good reason to clean them really well. Note the two Spitfire rear uprights pictured here.



They both seem OK, but upon closer examination the one of the left has severe wear in the hole for the rear radius rod pivot bolt.



This kind of damage can be repaired by boring the hole out, then "sleeving" it back to standard size. A small slice of an old valve guide can be used for the sleeve, welding it in place to provide the proper size bearing surface for the pivot bolt. There's nothing worse than driving your "Frame Off" restoration for the first time and hearing a "clunk" from somewhere you can't find. This is a prime example of discovering the cause of such a noise. If this part had not been cleaned meticulously, the elongated hole may have been overlooked.

REGATTA RULES

In order to compete in the 1999 DCTRA Regatta, your entry must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Size: Must fit completely inside a standard shoe box and allow the lid to close.
- 2. Power: Must be spring or rubber-band powered. (Note: This is a new rule). No electric motors or internal combustion engines permitted.
- 3. Guidance: Must be free-running. That is, no radio control or wires permitted.
- 4: Stamina: Your boat must survive multiple impacts with the far wall of the pool. "Catchers" (people) are not permitted, and the runs will be drag-racing style, with oneon-one elimination runs.

We're sure that this year's regatta will be challenging and rewarding for all you Engineer types out there.
