Technical Corner

Water leak problem

On the last DCTRA run organized by Dave Riddle I had a strange water leak which prevented me from completing the run. It was leaking very slightly inside the car on the passenger side. The leak did not occur when I was driving, only when the car was stopped. Finding where it was leaking from was not easy to see.

I narrowed it down to these possibilities:

- 1. Water Heater
- 2. Water heater connections
- 3. Hoses in and out of the water heater.
- 4. Hoses in and out of the firewall fitting

I decided I would take them all off for inspection and replacement. I ordered replacement silicon hoes and began the arduous task inside the car of removing them all. I also thought I might as well replace the firewall connection while I was doing this.

This was not fun, and I know some of you name your cars. During this exercise I named my car a few times in a language the clergy do not use!



The rust around the connections was causing the hoses not to seal and was weeping at the actual hoses.

So now new hoses and fitting and no leak!






