



This isn't the way it's supposed to work. Regardless of the bias anyone has towards the merits of the bill, the efforts of those who strove for its presentation should not simply be ignored. Our leaders complain about the dearth of involvement or even interest in the political process by everyday citizens, but when something as nonsensical as this happens, it's pretty obvious that without heavy inside clout we don't stand a chance. A travesty like this shouldn't happen again. Though I'm pretty sure that the house is too preoccupied with important things like kissing the EPA's behind, giving away free SUV's, going broke and welfare programs for the Bidwells to be embarrassed by their snubbing of our petty interests, we should let them know how we feel. Legislation in other states has gone a long way to infringe upon the collector's ability to enjoy fine automobiles. It looks like it's well on the way to happening here too. TR's as trailer queens is just no fun.






